Background to Save the Children

Save the Children New Zealand ('SCNZ') is a non-governmental organisation that fights for children's rights worldwide. SCNZ is currently managing projects in the South Pacific, South East Asia and East Africa. It is part of Save the Children International (SCI), which is made up of 27 member countries who work together to carry out joint programmes in more than I20 countries around the world. This makes SCI the world's largest independent child rights development organisation. Together, SCI members implement more than US\$1.3 billion worth of development projects annually.

Background to the position

I. Programme Strategy Research

We are currently reviewing our International Programmes strategy and need support to collate and summarise child rights situational analyses across the countries in which we currently and will potentially deliver projects especially in the Asia-Pacific. This research will include a further analysis of other agencies providing support in these areas and opportunities and resources for SCNZ interventions where possible.

2. Communications and content

Where possible the intern will provide additional support in completing SCNZ international programme and project summaries and further research support for sector and geographic priorities and SCNZ programme funding applications and reports.

3. Other Duties
